

Richard Hancock, clarinet, is currently Principal Clarinetist of Orchestra Miami, the Opus One Orchestra (Miami City Ballet) and The Symphonia of Boca Raton. Recently. Richard was featured as soloist with renowned conductor. Gerard Schwarz, and The Symphonia. Richard is on the faculty of Florida International University as clarinet instructor. In recent years, Richard has also served as Principal of the Atlantic Classical Orchestra, Florida Grand Opera, and Sunshine Pops and served as Principal Clarinetist of the Florida Philharmonic Orchestra and

Florida Grand Opera from 1984 until its bankruptcy in 2003. Before coming to South Florida, he played in many orchestras in the U.S. and abroad, including Principal Clarinet in Mexico City, and extra clarinet in the Dallas and Chicago Symphony Orchestras for recordings and tours. Highlights of his musical life in South Florida have included concerto appearances with the FPO, their award winning recordings and numerous chamber music performances. Richard also plays touring Broadway shows, playing "Wicked", "My Fair Lady", "West Side Story" and "Evita" most recently. Aside from music, Richard and his family are very involved in the rescue of retired racing greyhounds

Elaine Rinaldi Founder and Artistic Director of Orchestra Miamiis a Miami native who has chosen to return home and reinvest in her community. Under her artistic supervision and direction, Orchestra Miami has performed high quality classical music concerts to literally thousands of people through its annual Free Outdoor Concerts and introduced over 19.000 school children to classical music through its collaboration with the MDCPS Cultural Passport Program and In-School Performances. Recently, in

collaboration with the Miami Children's Institute, the African Heritage Cultural Arts Center and the Center for Social Change, she created and launched the Liberty City Sings Performance Project, a free after school program which teaches children about the humanities through opera. She is most proud of Orchestra Miami's "Discover Miami Through Music" series, which presents appropriately themed concerts in Miami's historic landmarks and other places of interest. The purpose of the series is to use music to encourage people to learn more about our collective history as a community and use music to illustrate that history, allowing people to experience music in a fresh surroundings.

Critics have called her performances "brilliant" and her interpretative work "impeccable". As Founder and Artistic Director of Orchestra Miami, Rinaldi has brought a new level of professionalism and quality to the local arts scene. Of her work with Orchestra Miami, Daniel Fernandez of El Nuevo Herald writes, "In just two years, Rinaldi has created an orchestra which, though small in size, is clearly of a high caliber", and of her opening night performance of the 2008 season, Lawrence A. Johnson of The Miami Herald writes, "the orchestra's playing was consistently energized, polished and responsive to Rinaldi over the 2 1/2-hour program, showing some of the fire and excitement of the [former Floridal Philharmonic on its best nights".

In addition to her work with Orchestra Miami, Rinaldi is much in demand as an opera conductor, chamber musician, recital collaborator, educator and vocal coach. Recent conducting engagements include her debut at the Tri-Cities Opera leading performances of Mozart's Don Giovanni, and she has collaborated in recital with international opera stars Russell Thomas, Elizabeth Caballero, Elaine Alvarez, Eglise Gutierrez and Yunah Lee, among many others. She is a recipient of Agnes Varis/Inter-Cities performing Arts Grant, a Finalist in the American Prize for Orchestral Conducting and Orchestral Performance (2010) and selected to participate in the League of American Orchestra's Women Conductors' Mentoring Circle with Joann Faletta.

Orchestra Miami is a unique, professional ensemble based in Miami-Dade County. Now in our 8th season, we see the Orchestra as a parallel for community. Each of our concerts is designed to bring neighbors together and enhance the quality of life for our residents. Our goal is to bring high-quality classical symphonic music to every person in Miami-Dade County, regardless of economic circumstance. As such, many of our programs are offered free of charge. Our signature programs include our annual Free Outdoor Concerts, our Free Family Concerts and our collaborations with the Miami Dade County Public Schools. Our orchestra is comprised of the most experienced, highly qualified local professional musicians, led by Elaine Rinaldi, Orchestra Miami's Founder and Artistic Director.
