Russian-born, Chicago-based cellist and composer Ian Maksin has gained international recognition for his beautiful tone, his unique innovative style of playing the instrument and for taking the cello well outside its conventional role. He gives over one hundred live performances annually in North and South America, Europe and Asia as a soloist as well as part of different collaborations. His recently released album of original music for solo cello titled "Soul Companion" has received great acclaim from critics and audiences around the globe. In his current hometown Chicago, Maksin often performs at the city's premier venues: Jay Pritzker Pavilion, Ravinia Festival outreach program, Old Town School of Folk Music, Chopin Theatre. He can be heard live on WFMT, WTTW, WBEZ, and his concerts have consistently been featured as "Critic's Pick" in the Chicago Tribune as well as the Time Out Magazine. In 2012 he was named "Citizen Musician" by the Chicago Symphony Orchestra for his contribution to city's vibrant musical life and community engagement.

Maksin has a long standing connection with South Florida. In 2000, he became principal cellist of the New World Symphony under direction of Michael Tilson Thomas. During his years in Florida he was also the cellist of the Delray String Quartet and appeared as a soloist with many orchestras including the New Philharmonic, Gulf Coast Symphony, and the Atlantic Classical Orchestra. Apart from being highly regarded as a classical artist, Maksin performs and collaborates with other artists in a variety of musical genres. He can often be heard and seen in collaborative projects with many other leading Chicago artists as well as members of Steppenwolf Theater Company, Chicago Symphony and Joffrey Ballet. As a guest artist, he has performed and recorded with Andrea Bocelli, P. Diddy, Snoop Dogg, Gloria Estefan and Barry Gibb. He has also opened performances for Sting and his guitarist Dominic Miller.

Elaine Rinaldi, Founder and Artistic Director of Orchestra Miami, is a Miami native who has chosen to return home and reinvest in her community. Under her artistic supervision and direction, Orchestra Miami has performed high quality classical music concerts to literally thousands of people through its annual Free Outdoor Concerts and introduced over 21,000 school children to classical music through its collaboration with the MDCPS Cultural Passport Program and In-School Performances. She is most proud of Orchestra Miami's "Discover Miami Through Music" series, which presents appropriately-themed concerts in Miami's historic landmarks and other places of interest; in addition to the Family Fun Series.

Founded in 2006 by Artistic Director Elaine Rinaldi, **Orchestra Miami** exists to fill the unique cultural needs of our community, and is successfully fulfilling its mission of bringing affordable concerts of quality symphonic music to all people in Miami-Dade County, providing people with opportunities to experience art, build community and educate through music.
