

With an AA in fashion design, she has worked in theatrical costume for 18 years. Marina is currently the Costume Design faculty and resident Costume Designer for Florida International University.

Ainex Carmona (Set/Lighting Designer) is a Senior at F.I.U. seeking her BFA in Theatrical Tech and Design. Her focus being Lighting and Scenic design. She looks forward to graduating and attending a Graduate Program come Fall 2016. She was assisted on this project by Samantha Llanes, an F.I.U. Theatre graduate with a focus in Theatrical Props, soon attending The University of Ohio.

Lucia Sassone (Stage Manager) is delighted to be working with Orchestra Miami for the first time. Born in Buenos Aires, Argentina, she is currently attending FIU and working on her B.A. in Theatre. Her latest stage managing production was Neil Simon's Rumors. She is also an actress and even hopes to one day to direct a production.

Ash Joseph (Assistant Costume Designer) Graduating from Florida International University with a BA, focuses on costume design and construction. As a student, she's had the opportunity to work on a few different shows, including Sleeping Beauty, Juanita's Statue, and assistant designed in An Ideal Husband, Ash has also worked with What If Works as assistant costume designer for their production of The Cherry Orchard as well as volunteered at the J-Cat Theatre where's she's worked on shows like Fiddler on the Roof and I Hate Hamlet.



Bass-Baritone and local Miamian Lloyd Reshard (noye) graduated from the University of Miami's Frost School of Music with a BM in Vocal Performance, where he had the privilege of performing the roles of Sarastro (The Magic Flute), the title role of The Mikado, and Dulcamara (L'Elisir d'amore) during his degree program. Since then, Lloyd has performed mostly new operatic works, such as a duel role of Henrich Himmler and Mr. Van Pels in Your's Truly Anne by composer Michael Ross, and has maintained a constant presence in Miami's growing operatic community as an associate Chorister with

the Florida Grand Opera for 8 seasons. Mr. Reshard is also well known for his oratorio and recital performances. He has sung the Bass solos in Handel's Messiah with the MasterWorks Chorale of West Palm Beach, Naples Bach Ensemble, First Presbyterian Church of Margate, and with the New Presbyterian Church of Pompano Beach (among many others). He has also performed as the soloist under Paul Whiting in Schubert's Mass in G, Mass of the Children by John Rutter, and Saint-Saens Christmas Oratorio. Lloyd's recital "Over Jordan: Freedom of American Negros in Song", was premiered in 2011 with Arts at St. Johns and later performed in segments for Temple Israel's Guava Rugelach Festival. In 2012, Lloyd was awarded the NEA Encouragement Award at the District Metropolitan Opera National Council Auditions.



Haitian-American soprano Jouvanca Jean-Baptiste (Mrs. Nove) has been hailed for her "impressive singing" and "big, Verdian lyric dramatic sound". She is well-known in the opera world for her lush soprano, well-suited to the roles of Puccini, Verdi, Strauss, Mozart, and the operas of the verismo genre. Recent career highlights include her debuts as Floria Tosca in Tosca and Anna in Nabucco with Florida Grand Opera, as well as covering the roles of Christine Mannon in Marvin David Levy's Mourning Becomes Electra and Abigaille in Nabucco as a member of the company's

prestigious Young Artists Program during the 2013-14 Season. Ms. Jean-Baptiste sang the rarely performed Beethoven concert aria "Ah, Non Turbarti" for Orchestra Miami's 2015 Beethoven on the Beach concerts, and sang the role of The Mother in Orchestra Miami's 2012-13 production of Menotti's Amahl and the Night Visitors. She was a Principal Resident Artist for two seasons at Opera San Jose, where she performed to critical acclaim as Violetta Valery in La traviata, Marquerite in Faust, Nedda in Pagliacci, Mimi in La boheme, the title role in Tosca and the title role in David Carlson's Anna Karenina in the West Coast Premiere of the opera. Ms. Jean-Baptiste makes her home in South Florida, where she continues to study with Oscar Diaz, Jr., Executive Director of the Performers Music Institute.

Elaine Rinaldi

Founder and Artistic Director of Orchestra Miami is a Miami native who has chosen to return home and reinvest in her community. Under her artistic supervision and direction, Orchestra Miami has performed high quality classical music concerts to literally thousands of people through its annual Free Outdoor Concerts and introduced over 19,000 school children to classical music through its collaboration with the MDCPS Cultural

Passport Program and In-School Performances. Recently, in collaboration with the Miami Children's Institute, the African Heritage Cultural Arts Center and the Center for Social Change, she created and launched the Liberty City Sings Performance Project, a free after school program which teaches children about the humanities through opera. She is most proud of Orchestra Miami's "Discover Miami Through Music" series, which presents appropriately themed concerts in Miami's historic landmarks and other places of interest. The purpose of the series is to use music to encourage people to learn more about our collective history as a community and use music to illustrate that history, allowing people to experience music in a fresh surroundings.

Critics have called her performances "brilliant" and her interpretative work "impeccable". As Founder and Artistic Director of Orchestra Miami, Rinaldi has brought a new level of professionalism and quality to the local arts scene. Of her work with Orchestra Miami, Daniel Fernandez of El Nuevo Herald writes, "In just two years, Rinaldi has created an orchestra which, though small in size, is clearly of a high caliber", and of her opening night performance of the 2008 season, Lawrence A. Johnson of The Miami Herald writes, "the orchestra's playing was consistently energized, polished and responsive to Rinaldi over the 2 ½-hour program, showing some of the fire and excitement of the [former Florida] Philharmonic on its best nights".

In addition to her work with Orchestra Miami, Rinaldi is much in demand as an opera conductor, chamber musician, recital collaborator, educator and vocal coach. Recent conducting engagements include her debut at the Tri-Cities Opera leading performances of Mozart's Don Giovanni, and she has collaborated in recital with international opera stars Russell Thomas, Elizabeth Caballero, Elaine Alvarez, Eglise Gutierrez and Yunah Lee, among many others. She is a recipient of Agnes Varis/Inter-Cities performing Arts Grant, a Finalist in the American Prize for Orchestral Conducting and Orchestral performance (2010) and selected to participate in the League of American Orchestra's Women Conductors' Mentoring Circle with Joann Faletta



Michael Yawney (Stage Director) wrote and directed Exile Jesus Starbucks, which was seen at Miami Light Project's Here & Now 2015. He directed Juan C. Sanchez's Catherine's Wheel at FIU, Rudi Goblen's PET at Miami Light Project as well as An American Soldier's Tale and Amahl and the Night Visitors for Orchestra Miami. His longest production was Heather Woodbury's 12-hour stand-up novel As the Globe Warms, which was seen at Austin's Vortex Rep, L.A.'s Redcat and in Miami at FIU. Yawney wrote 1,000 Homosexuals which premiered at the Arsht Center. He currently teaches at FIU.


